As the new growing season gets underway at our ‘flagship’ long-term experiment, RainDrop, at Wytham Woods, we are delighted to report that Sara Middleton (pictured) will be working with the experiment from this year. Sara is a first-year NERC Doctoral Training Partnership student at the University of Oxford. Her previous research has been in invasion science and trait-based ecology. For her PhD, she is interested in working at the intersection between functional traits and demography. The project aims to compare a suite of above and below-ground traits and demographic rates of individuals within the grassland community across the different drought treatments. New ECT Maintenance Grant Awarded **Peatland-ES-UK**

ECT recently awarded a maintenance grant to Andreas Heinemeyer at the University of York to assist with his work on the Peatland-ES-UK long-term experimental sites in North Yorkshire and Lancashire. The grant will be used to upgrade and replace ageing rhizon peat water samplers. This will enable continuation of seasonal water quality sampling and the support of two PhD projects.
